Kellenberg Memorial High School offers this time-tested curriculum to students with varying educational needs. Students in the Honors Program take four years of a world language. Students in the Academic I Program study a world language for three years and take a course in College Writing during the fourth year. Students in the Academic II Program take four years of English Composition in the place of a world language class. Academic II students also study American Sign Language in the Junior and Senior years. Also students may have the option to gain college credit in College Writing, American History II, Intro to Calculus, English, Art Portfolio Prep, Senior Religion, and World Languages.

GENERAL INFORMATI

In addition to the high school program, Kellenberg Memorial also has a middle school division for sixth, seventh, and eighth grade students. For more information on the Brother Joseph C. Fox Latin School, contact the Latin School Office.

In order to be considered for admission to the Freshman class, the student must successfully complete the eighth grade by passing all classes and presenting adequate academic credentials. The usual means of application begins with the Catholic High School Entrance Examination. Each applicant must sit for this exam on Saturday, October 29, 2016. An application for this test and other details on this program are available at all Catholic grade schools, Religious Education Centers, through the Kellenberg Memorial Admissions Office 516-292-0200, ext. 210 or at www.CHSEE.org.

Transfer students are not accepted for the Sophomore, Junior and Senior years of high school. The final judgment for admission is reserved to the sole discretion of the Principal.

KMHS does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, sex, or national or ethnic origin in its educational, admissions, or financial policies, activities, athletics, or school administered programs.

KMHS, a Roman Catholic coeducational school, was founded to serve the Catholics of Long Island. Priority of admission is given to baptized Roman Catholic students.

Tuition for the 2016-2017 school year is \$9,675. This amount may be paid in full, in two installments, or over a ten month period. If tuition is paid in full by August 8, 2016, the family receives a \$150 discount. Parents are required to enroll in an automatic direct debit program. The two-payment option asks for one-half of the tuition on August 8th and the second half on January 9th. There is a \$350 non-refundable registration fee once a student has been accepted. IPADS

Kellenberg Memorial continues to feature a time-tested Marianist education while introducing cutting edge technology. Current ninth, tenth, and eleventh grade students are engaging the iPad as the primary source of textbooks, notebooks, and workbooks, as well as utilizing the device as a means of sharing work collaboratively in class and with their teachers. Harnessing the vast power of this digital resource, the students are meeting the traditional demands of a Catholic education with almost limitless resources. A \$200 annual payment enables a "lease to own" program so that the student graduates with the device that encapsulates his/her entire high school education.
